## The Deacon Discusses

Although the days grow shorter and the weather turns colder, I have always loved the season of Advent. There is something that is comforting in a season that calls each of us to stop and faithfully wait, through prayer, through meditation, through intention for the coming of the gift of God Incarnate.

Advent calls us out of the hustle and bustle of the world that surrounds us beyond these doors, into a world of quiet and patient waiting. Because we had the unique situation of an early Thanksgiving this year, we have been surrounded by the sights and sounds and retail frenzy that accompany the Holiday Season. And now, more than ever, the season of Advent calls us to slow down, and for that I am always grateful. Something very big, very important, life changing, is about to be remembered and it is nice to have not only permission, but encouragement as well, to pause and take notice of the immeasurable event that we will soon celebrate. So it is right and fitting that we set aside these four Sundays as a time to do just that.

Several years ago I wrote about my son, now a father twice over himself, and the case of the missing Baby Jesus. It was common for us as a family to pull out the decorations for Christmas early in the Advent season; the tree had to wait, but the rest of the festooning could commence. Bill and I had purchased a very dear (to us) crèche set at the National Cathedral not long after we were married, and every year it took a place of honor in the dining room. One year, when our son was about six or seven, we noticed that the Baby Jesus was suddenly missing from his place in the manger. We questioned our children and finally our son (the once and future attorney) admitted that he knew where the Babe was. It seems that he had decided that it was not yet Christmas and therefore the Baby Jesus could not be placed with the rest of crèche. Yes, he knew where the Baby Jesus was hidden,

And so we as his parents found ourselves waiting with our own different sense of anticipation and wonder that Advent season for the return of the Baby Jesus. Sure enough, when we returned from the family service on Christmas Eve, our son found time during the hustle and bustle of preparing dinner to sneak off, and without any fanfare or fuss, place the Babe back in the manger. At dinner he declared, "Now we have been to church, now it is officially Christmas, now the Baby Jesus can be borned." It was a small gesture in the larger scheme of things I suppose, but it did in its own way center all of us on patiently waiting during those Advents.

The tradition continued until he became an adult, with a job, a wife and family of his own in Chicago. But I often think back to those years of not hurrying the one thing above all that makes all the difference, the arrival of light into the world, in the human form of a baby. And some traditions deserve to be continued. As I said, he has children of his own now, and as their Grandmother I am very much looking forward to teaching them their father's Advent tradition!

The blankets will go directly to Keystone, and the fleece blanket kits will be cut and tied here at St. Christopher's and then passed on to Keystone once completed.

**All donations are due by Sunday, December 17th.**

~ Use LED Christmas lights. We will again be collecting lights that do not work. Look for the box in the lower narthex.

~ Use real dishes and napkins - disposable plates and silverware might be easier but just make your guests do the dishes. If you need to buy disposable, buy items that can be composted.

~ Buy local

~ Give battery-free gifts

~Purchase candles made from soy or beeswax. Candles made from paraffin are made from petroleum.

~Shop with reusable bags.

~Decorate a tree outside for the birds - use peanut butter on a pine cone and roll in bird seed

or hang grapes and dried apples on a tree

~Make your presents or give environmentally friendly gifts.
