


# Of Gold, Exotic Spices, and Tater Tot Hotdish by Fr. Randy+

Then Herod secretly called for the magi and learned from them the exact time when the star had appeared. Then he sent them to Bethlehem, saying, "Go and search diligently for the child, and when you have found him, bring me word so that I may also go and pay him homage." When they had heard the king, they set out, and there, ahead of them, went the star that they had seen in the east, until it stopped over the place where the child was. When they saw that the star had stopped, they were overwhelmed with joy. On entering the house, they saw the child with Mary his mother, and they knelt down and paid him homage. Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. (Matt 2:7-11)

On Christmas Eve-Eve (yeah, I know this is not an official holiday)several of the St. C faithful gathered at church to participate in the "Greening of the Church." It was an exhilarating experience to decorate for the coming Christmastide. Greens and decorated trees and candles and lights and angels...and, of course, the beautiful nativity set prominently placed at the altar. We are intrigued by the intricate details of the clothed figures and the glorious colors of their richly adorned regal fabrics. This is especially true in the portrayal of the kings visiting the Christ Child and bearing exotic gifts.

"We Three Kings...," is the immediate carol that comes to mind as we approach The Feast of The Epiphany on January 6—the day appointed on the

church calendar that the Kings followed the star--traveling far to pay homage to the Son of God laying in a manger. The story is told and retold, and the details become more and more diverse as it is interpreted further and further distanced from the text. The identification of "three kings" and "three gifts" is assumed as the story and song have been handed down through the cultural lens of many centuries.

On The Feast of The Epiphany—the 12<sup>th</sup> Day of Christmas—we celebrate that the wise men not only bring gifts, but they also herald the new year ahead. Christmas is over, and so we push onward towards Candlemas and then to Lent.

But, as we lean into the new year, let us not forget the important inspiration the magi inspire in each of us—the significance of bearing of gifts to honor and celebrate the birth of the Christ Child. It encourages us to likewise share our own abundant gifts in the name of Jesus with the whole world. The magi brought gifts of their riches. While we may not be rich in a purely economic sense, each of us are uniquely blessed with God-given gifts, gifts meant to share with the world.

One of our kings in the St. C's nativity scene is holding a lovely silver metallic box. An altar guild member stepped back from this king, smiled and said, "I think this king could be presenting a Tater Tot Hotdish!" We joyfully giggled at the improbable possibility of this actually happening. But, once again, I pondered what this comment clarified in my own mind in this moment. Each of us is called to joyfully share our unique gifts with God and others—even if this gift is that of compassionately feeding of people, in body and in soul—even if that gift is a delicious Tater Tot Hotdish.



With Christmas now over, we can take down our Christmas trees and decorations, and look forward to the lengthening of days. So let us end as we begin. Let us be vigilant and watchful, waiting for our Lord and ensuring that Christmas never becomes less than what it truly is: the celebration of Christ's nativity, the sharing of the gifts of God, the welcoming each year of God made flesh, revealed among us, now and until the end of time. *Randy*+

# **Vestry Shorts**

The vestry met on December 18th.

- · At the top of the items discussed was the budget for next year and stewardship. We still have a few parishioners we have not heard from in the way of a pledge. The budget was looked at and \$56,300 is needed to cover the shortfall between the budget and current pledges. We have surplus funds to cover the shortfall in 2024. The surplus will run out in about four years unless we increase pledges or lower expenses. This will be discussed at the annual meeting in January.
- · Vestry candidates update: For next year, it has been a challenge to find Vestry candidates. At this time there is only 1 member who has stepped up to serve on the vestry. We have few people to ask, many have declined due to having already served once or more! If you are interested please let Fr. Randy or a vestry member know.
- · Fellowship/Social Activities: Many great events were offered at the Event Fair, and signed up for. The sign-up sheets will continue to be posted until the first of the year. If you haven't signed up yet, there are still openings for many events!

- The 75th Anniversary Committee will hold a fundraising event on May 19, 2024, after the 8 o'clock and the 10:30 services to help cover the cost of the celebration on October 6, 2024. Details to come.
