

It is a time of fun and transition, of sorts, as the grandkids from Kansas City spend the week at Grandma's House. And it is not only the Kansas tribe—as the local Golden Valley grandkids join in the action with sleepovers and meals.

It is always a treat to come to Grandma's House. At Grandma's House, new rules can come into play—not the day in, day out rules that apply at their homes. Some are always the same, but some new twists and turns add to the anticipation, excitement, and expectations of daily life. God calls each one of us to be the bearers of God's **Love Language**—necessary and life giving.

Sunday Ministries

We have so very many ways to serve at St. Christopher's on Sunday mornings, and this is a great time to jump in and start something new! Here are just a few of those opportunities:

- Ushers (Greet folks, pass out bulletins, etc)
- Lectors (read scripture)
- Crucifer (lead the procession, help set the table for Eucharist)
- Intercessor (read prayers of the people)

Plastic Bag Recycling

Have you noticed the bins throughout church that say "Plastic Bag Recycling"? For many years, St. Christopher's has been collecting bags and bringing them to Merrick, Incorporated. in Vadnais Heights. Our own parishioner, Mike Mann, works there. You might not think bringing your plastic bags to church amounts to much, but since 2008, Merrick has recycled 12,285,760 pounds of plastic! Some of the plastic comes from donations from places like St. Christopher's and some from hospitals and other companies. In fact, 851,470 pounds of surgical wrap has been processed. The employees at Merrick sort and process the collected plastic which goes to the company Trex to become composite deck flooring.

So, St. Christopher's – keep up the good work! Keep bringing your plastic bags to church—and, you can even tell your neighbors and relatives about the program and bring theirs, too. It adds up to a lot of plastic that is not in the landfill!
