This Lenten Season of Disfiguration—yet, a Time of Hope *by Fr. Randy*

I recently read a short article written by Brother James Koester, Superior of the Society of Saint John the Evangelist. His writing struck me deeply as we step forward into Lententide once more. It is given me pause to think that we have been living in somewhat of an extended Lent, which began nearly one year ago, as we began hearing reports of an aggressive virus that was impacting a good portion of the world. The reports of disabling illness and exponentially growing infections and death were beyond all imagination. The pandemic had struck, and we were horrified to discover the rapid growth in this country. Over 500,000 persons have died in our country and well over two million have succumbed worldwide.

Br. Koester has observed that the past year has been a time of disfiguration, as many have been disfigured by the rampant disease and death. Many more have recovered from the COVID-19 disease, but are still living with fears and lingering after effects of this pandemic.

This disfiguration has not been limited to our bodies alone. It has also been a time of disfiguration of the body politic and systemic structures of racism, access to justice, equality in quality education, and food/housing insecurity. Businesses, churches, and schools may not have been “closed,” but have been significantly disrupted. Economic and social problems have had a bright light shone upon them which can no longer be ignored. Upheavals which have

occurred will require years to repair and reconcile.

This is a season of disfiguration. Yet it is also a time of hope.

At Christmas time we celebrated and remembered God's act of divine self-emptying when God broke all the limits of generosity in the incarnation of the Son for our sake, *"who, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God as something to be exploited, but empties himself, taking the form of a slave, being born in human likeness. And being found in human form, he humbled himself and became obedient to the point of death- even human death on a cross."*

St. John's gospel shines a bright light on the truth that *"the Word became flesh and lived among us."* In coming to earth to walk and live among us, God took on our limitations and even our disfigurations, by submitting to death, disease, and loss. God took on our pain, sorrow, grief, loneliness, worry, and anxiety. All of this, God took on in the person of his Son, Jesus.

This is a thing of wonderment. We find ourselves today in a time of disfiguration. The wonder of it all is that God has been there before us and has transfigured what in us is disfigured—transfigured into something that is new once more. Even as our world is gripped with pain and loss, the light of God's glory is shining through.

In this imperfect world of grief and loss, and difficult times, we are being transformed into God's image. Though we are not perfect, we are seeing a reflection of the Glory of the Lord. Author Leonard Cohen writes, *"Forget your perfect offering. There is a crack in everything. That's how the light gets in."*

We may be tempted to see only disfiguration as we look at the world, or our own lives, but that is not the whole truth. The whole truth is *that which God has assumed, God has healed.* Br. Koester goes on to say, *"Take heart. God in the person of Jesus has been here before us, and even now is transforming and transfiguring our disfigured world. In so doing, God in Christ is making all things new once more, and that includes even you."*

With hope and faith in the One who is making our world new.
